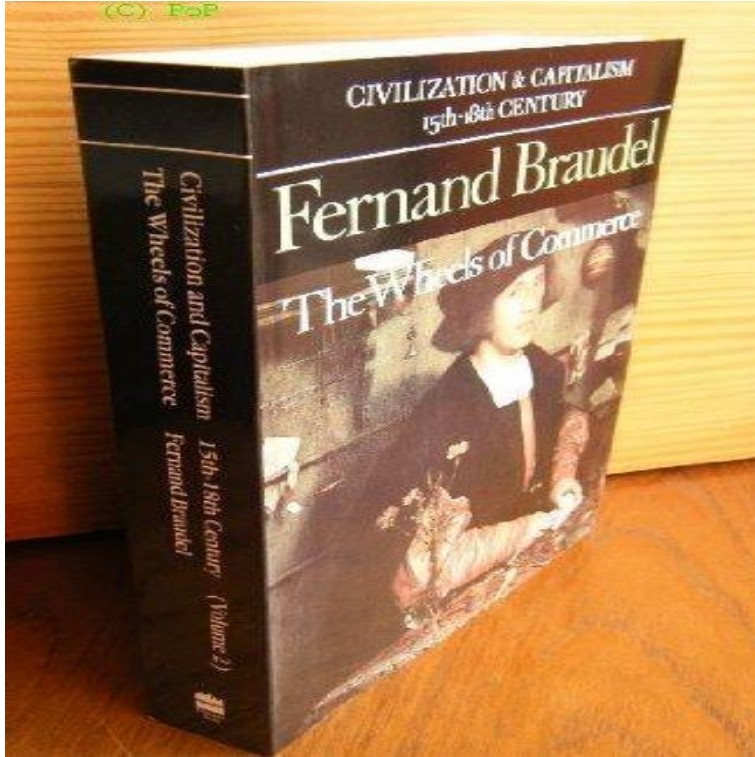


The Wheels of Commerce: Civilization



Originally published in the early 1970s, *Civilization and Capitalism, 15th-18th Century* traces the social and economic history of the world from the Middle Ages to the Industrial Revolution. The series consists of three volumes: *The Structures of Everyday Life: Civilization and Capitalism, 15th-18th Century* (Volume 1), *The Wheels of Commerce: Civilization and Capitalism, 15th-18th Century* (Volume 2), and *The Perspective of the World: Civilization and Capitalism, 15th-18th Century* (Volume 3). *The Wheels of Commerce* (Volume 2) focuses on the development of mechanisms of exchange—shops, markets, trade networks, and banking—in the pre-industrial world. The book is a classic work of economic and social history, written by the noted French historian Fernand Braudel. It is available in hardcover and paperback editions. The book is highly regarded for its detailed analysis and is a must-read for anyone interested in the history of commerce and capitalism.
